Support to 2nd Generation of New Immigrants: Cathay Charity Group continued its partnership with Eden Social Welfare Foundation in conducting Leadership Development Camp for 2nd Generation Immigrants, supporting them in developing their diverse potentials and engaging them in charity work for better integration and sense of identity.

Education and Empowerment: The continuation of Cathay Youth Excellence Scholarship and Dream Come True Program provided financial support to the school children living in remote country. Considering the rampant issues of drugs and frauds, Cathay Charity Foundation conducted Antidrugs & Anti-fraud Dual Program in schools. The anti-drugs and anti-scam knowledge were conveyed to students through entertainment such as e-sports and board games. Cathay's 2024 anti-drug campaign was awarded the title of Anti-Drug Meritorious Group by Executive Yuan and received the public recognition: Cathay has actively committed to anti-drug efforts and its priority in administrative counseling has reaped great results in anti-drug activities.

Social Events: In order to relieve the blood shortage in summer, Cathay conducted Summer Blood Donation Campaign, calling for people to roll up sleeve for donating blood for the good cause. The Winter Warmth program has been carried out continuously for 23 years. In 2024, the Cathay people

visited 154 primary schools in remote country. With the newly added financial quiz game, this year's program offered a fun and educational method for children to gain financial knowledge and positive energy for a lifetime. On April 3, a 7.2 magnitude earthquake struck Taiwan, with Hualien being the hard-hit area. Cathay immediately launched disaster relief program in Hualien and dispatched emergency funds for people to live through the first hardest few days.


Promotion of Arts and Culture: In its support of art and cultural activities, Cathay has continued its sponsorship to the 48th National Oil Painting Exhibition and Cathay Arts Festival: Emerging Artists Exhibition. In addition, Cathay invited amateur artists joining the cause of Charitable Painting Exhibition, an affiliated event of Elevated Tree Program, with the program donors receiving the featured paintings and all the proceeds going to the Program. Being the perfect combination of art and charity, this project and concept has recieved praises since its commencement in 2018.



2024 Annual Work Progress Report for **Cathay Charity Foundation**


As the world enters "post-pandemic era" with the rapid rise of generative AI, not only have the political and economic conditions changed drastically, but Taiwan is soon to enter "super aged society" (with the people aged 65 and above account for 20% of the total population). These changes are expected to bring challenges and impact to the promotion of charity causes. In 2024, Cathay Charity Foundation upheld the philosophy "Spreading Happiness and Hope" and provided the most needed help to the people and environment of Taiwan, hoping that every person would get closer to happiness due to Cathay's care.

According to the Chairman of Cathay Financial Holding Group and Director of Cathay Charity Foundation Hong-Tu Tsai, the important thing for Cathay in 2024 was to embrace the values of diversity, accelerate cross-border communication and continue to drive growth through technology innovation and corporate sustainable development. He also encouraged all Cathay people to "bravely explore outward and view the unknown as challenges and challenges as opportunities; unlimited possibilities need to happen when everyone works together and pools collective wisdom."

Holding onto such belief, Cathay Charity Group, and its affiliated Cathay Charity Foundation, Cathay United Bank Foundation and Cathay Real Estate Foundation, actively promote emergency relief and environmental protection, and offer care services to school children in remote country, 2nd generation of new immigrants, young students, senior citizens, and disadvantaged communities. In the year of 2024, the total expenditure was NT\$ 29,473,625 (US\$ 898,860). The information of the major expenditure is described as below:

I. Social Welfare Activities

1. Care program for 2nd generation immigrants



sense of environmentalism. A total of 67 courses was held in 2024, with 1,741 participants.

2. Empowerment Programs for School Children

- (1) Dream Come True Program: This program offers children an opportunity to experience the journey of setting up a goal, working on it and achieving the goal. It helps to cultivate children to challenge and overcome obstacles, making which the ability that they can carry for a lifetime. The categories of challenges include art and music, physical strength, community and so on. The 2024 Dream Come True Program selected 24 schools and supported 480 children to complete their projects with a total funding of NT\$ 4,540,000 (US\$ 138,457).
- (2) After-school care program: In order to strengthen the social safety net and support the children of fragile families, Cathay's three Foundations provided support to the following four after-school care programs conducted by Chongwen Women's Association of Yunlin (Oyster Shack), Let Love Fly Association of Hualien (Let Love Fly Program), Foundation of Pescadores Citizens (Children's Book Club) and Playful Education Association for Children of Taipei (Twilight Box). This care program mainly targets on the children from singleparent families, new immigrant families, intergenerational families, and indigenous families. Through the diverse learning experiences, it helps children find self-recognition, confidence and hope for them to build a bright future.
- (3) "Teach For Taiwan" cooperation project Cathay Charity Group has launched a three-year (09/2022-09/2025) cooperation with TFT where Cathay's three Foundations jointly support TFT in recruiting and training teachers for remote countries. This initiative supports young teachers to go to remote countries and strives for creating a fair and premium environment for children and flip the education quality in these places. The funding for each year is NT\$ 4 million (US\$ 121,988).

3. Youth and Talent Development

(1) Cathay Youth Excellence Scholarship: Co-organized by Cathay Charity Foundation, Cathay United Bank Foundation, and Cathay Real Estate Foundation, this project fulfills our responsibility and mission for empowering the youth by concrete actions. The 2024 Scholarships presented a total of NT\$ 8.4 million (US\$ 256,176) to 26 groups of awardees for their charity projects and 100 high school students for their academic achievements.

- (2) Mixed Disabled Troupe: Cathay Charity Foundation has worked with Mixed Disabled Troupe, a group consisting of disabled performers, for a long time. In 2024, the group conducted 7 charitable performances in schools. Through their dance performance, they conveyed important life values to 2,000 young people.
- (3) Volunteer services collaboration with University Clubs: Extending care to remote country and new immigrant children, Cathay Charity Foundation worked with university clubs by sponsoring their winter and summer camp activities. In 2024, a total funding of NT\$ 209,930 (US\$ 6,402) was granted to 66 activities, benefiting 11,253 participants.

4. Winter Warmth Program

The 2024 Winter Warmth was held at 154 elementary schools in the remote country where resources were hard to arrive, sending winter clothing to the children there and benefiting 12,500 people.

5. Senior Care

Starting from 2022, Cathay Life Insurance has made senior friendly as its focus. It has also worked with Cathay Charity Foundation launching a series of care projects, including deepening the project of Happy Farm, and adding a new station in the tribal area in Yuli Taownship, Hualien in 2024. In terms of its long-term anti-fraud campaign towards senior citizens, the Foundation and Cathay Life Insurance, under partnership with local police stations, jointly launched more than 270 events, benefiting more than 10,000 seniors.

The Foundation also launched senior health programs in 2024. Working with University of Taipei, the Foundation and Cathay Life Insurance conducted health activities at the Cathay Happy Farm in Changbin Township, Taitung and in Nandi Community in Shetou, Changhua.

6. Support for the Underprivileged

(1) Subsidies for low-income households and medical services

Every year in Taiwan, numerous families suffer from distress due to natural disasters, major illness, or accidents, which put their life and economy into immediate difficulties. In order to help them weather such difficult times, the Foundation, since 2009, has extended a helping hand through Cathay volunteers who pay visit and support for them to get over difficulties. In 2024, a total of 146 families were visited and supported by Cathay's network, with a subsidy amount of NT\$ 2,341,000 (US\$ 71,394), helping them get through the hardships of life.

(2) Other donations

Other sponsorship recipients included Tsinghua University, Central Police University, Andrew Charity Association (or called Andrew Food Bank), and other local governments, schools and social welfare groups.

The total expenditure for the above-mentioned causes was NT\$ 23,570,939 (US\$ 718,845).

II. Social and Environmental Events



In 2024, Cathay Charity Foundation continued to work with Taiwan Blood Services Foundation in holding the blood donation campaign. The campaign received support from 42,118 donors and collecting 64,315 bags of blood. The result was able to provide sufficient supply to medical use and allow patients who need blood to resume their health again.

2. Anti-drug Awareness Campaign

Considering the population exposed to drug problem is getting younger, Cathay Charity Foundation invited various relevant parties to jointly launch anti-drug campaign in schools. For the 2024 campaign, the acrobatic troupe Han Dong H.D.A. offered five anti-drug performances, benefiting 4,200 students. Against Wind Theatre provided 6 anti-drug awareness events in schools and youth counseling centers with more than 510 students participating.

Furthermore, Cathay Life Insurance joined the one week "2024 Anti-drug Anti-fraud Exhibition for Safe Campus" held by Taipei City Government at Chiangti Plaza. In the two exhibition areas set up by Cathay, people can learn about the hazards about the drugs and increase their awareness regarding frauds through interactive games.

3. Charity Bazaars

Last year, the Foundation resumed Charity Bazaars in Taipei (the 8th year), Taichung (the 14th year) and Kaohsiung (the 11th year) jointly with Eden Social Welfare Foundation, YMCA Taichung and YMCA Kaohsiung. The Taipei event was also joined by Cathay Financial Holding Group, Cathay Consultant, and Cathay Hospitality Management. National Police Agency was also invited to set up a booth for anti-fraud promotion. The three Charity Bazaars attracted almost 20,000 patrons with more than 1,280 volunteers and 50 student volunteers (total work time exceeding 7,980 hours). The proceeds from these events reached NT\$ 3.06 million (US\$ 93,321), all of which would be allocated to the causes for the remote country, indigenous people, and under-privileged 2nd-generation resident children to alleviate the gap in educational resources.

The total expenditure in this regard was NT\$ 4,446,646 (US\$ 135,610).







2024 Annual Work Progress Report for Cathay United Bank Foundation



In 2024, Cathay United Bank Foundation implemented all works, including education for children, charity and public welfare, art events and sponsorship, in accordance with its annual work plan. In the year of 2024, the total expenditure was 36,821,224 (US\$ 1,122,941). The information of the major expenditures is as follows:

I. Education for Children

1. Elevated Tree Program—Grow A Big Tree From A Shoot

The Foundation continued the execution of the Elevated Tree Program, helping the basic education to take root and ensuring children's access to school and further a future of their own. In 2024, the Elevated Tree Program supported 5,907 under-privileged junior high and elementary school students.

At the same time, the Program extended its focus to sports events, as in line with its spirit-growing a big tree. The Program supported the physical education at different junior high schools and elementary schools so that children were able to learn self-discipline and team spirit in large sports events and discover themselves through competitions. In 2024, the Foundation sponsored 17 sports teams including the Jianshi Junior High School Judo Team in Hsinchu County to support their participation in competitions, training expenses and purchase of gears. It also sponsored the Sunrise Village Cup National Junior Football Game.

To improve children's capabilities through diversified learning, and to bridge the urban-rural gap, promote sustainable development and life-long learning, the Foundation supported Yue-Ming Elementary & Junior High School in Yilan and other units for developing characteristic curriculum. The total expenditure in this regard was NT\$11,100,648 (US\$338,548).

2. Campaigns organized across Cathay Charity Group

The co-organized projects include Cathay Youth Excellence Scholarship, Teach For Taiwan, Dream Come True Program, After School Care Program in the remote country, Winter Warmth Program and the production of Cathay Charity Group Annual Report. The total expenditure in this regard was NT\$6,530,000 (US\$199,146).

II. Charity, Public Welfare and Sponsoring Activities

The causes undertaken in this regard aimed at supporting the development of indigenous communities and their social enterprises and tourism, promoting diversified education for the children in the remote country. The Foundation took concrete action to sponsor charity activities such as Kingston's A Bag of Hope. An expenditure of NT\$ 400,000 (US\$ 12,199) was spent to support the 87th Tai-Yang Art Exhibition organized by Tai-Yang Art Association and the 48th National Oil Painting Contest and Exhibition by the Oil Art Society. In addition, the Foundation purchased their self-made products from Yu-Cheng Social Welfare Foundation and Pintung Christian Bethany Home as a support to social enterprises.

III. Art Events

In order to support local art and promote art education, Cathay United Art Center has been regularly holding art exhibitions and Art Lectures, providing a platform for Taiwanese artists and free access to art appreciation and knowledge for the public. Cathay's arts events in 2024 included 10 art exhibitions and four Art Talk Lecture Series, including two rounds of Elevated Tree Program----Charitable Painting Exhibition featuring amateur artists. The goal is to help the remote country children. Furthermore, the Foundation produced the corporate art calendar featuring local artists' works, as a well wish to deliver the beauty of art. The total expenditure in this regard was NT\$ 780,000 (US\$ 23,787).







2024 Annual Work Progress Report for Cathay Real Estate Foundation

For the year of 2024, Cathay Real Estate Foundation followed its annual plan and spared no efforts in conducting charity and environmental causes and providing help and care, hoping to achieve a prosperous future for all. The Foundation's affiliated libraries are located in major cities of Taiwan. Reading nourishes one's soul and new knowledge enriches one's mind. Lin Yuan Libraries also hold talent courses from time to time, which has become a pleasant daily routine. To be kind to others is to be kind to yourself. The Foundation organized Summer Blood Donation Campaign, New Immigrant Care Program, Winter Warmth Program and Cathay Youth Excellence Scholarship to support our youth. The Foundation also provided sponsorship to Teach For Taiwan, hoping that all the children who received help would work hard and harvest a promising future.

I.Lin Yuan Libraries

As the old saying goes, "one who is filled with knowledge always behaves in elegance." The Foundation has established 9 Lin Yuan Libraries around Taiwan. Being around with stacks of knowledges, book lovers send out elegant vibes and accumulate wisdom in their mind. In the fast-pacing modern world, people constantly cling to their electronic devices and become irritable due to the tiring daily work. Flipping through the pages of magazines and quietly reading books can settle one's emotions and release healing to them.

II. Talent courses in Lin Yuan Libraries

Lin Yuan Libraries hold Talent Learning Programs every year. Each library thoughtfully designs and organizes these courses for people to play out their creativity. Participants make beautiful and exquisite craft works or paintings. Life gets to be filled with more joy and colors.

III. Campaigns organized across Cathay Charity Group

1. After-school Care Program

The Foundation provided support to four after-school care programs conducted by Chongwen Women's Association of Yunlin (Oyster Shack), Let Love Fly Association of Hualien (Let Love Fly Program), Foundation of Pescadores Citizens (Children's Book Club) and Playful Education Association for Children of Taipei (Twilight Box). To make sure the children in remote country do not fall behind in their learning, this program aims at improving the disparity in educational resources and cultivating children's sense of self-recognition for them to grow strong with love.

2. Summer Blood Donation Campaign

Donating blood is like sprinkling nectar on a withered life, with drops of love gathering into a vast sea. Giving blood for free is an act of kindness. Simply by rolling up one's sleeve, one life can be saved, letting it set sail again toward a calm and beautiful future.

3. Winter Warmth Program and Dream Come True Program

We collected all kinds of supplies in winter and hauled them up to remote mountain towns. The arrival of warm and heartfelt donations put smiles on people's faces, making people feel the love during the year-end holiday season. Kids cheerfully bounced around, while flowers and grass sprouted like spring had come early, filling the air with a soft, happy vibe.

4. Cathay Youth Excellence Scholarship

Instead of just handing out fish, we should teach people how to catch their own. Rather than simply giving out charity, it is better to help those talented young people chase their dreams. By providing scholarships, the Foundation support these students to polish their skills, push their limits, and explore uncharted territory. We hope one day they would be able to soar in the sky of their dreams like eagles and give back to the society. Leading by example and inspiring others, shining bright as daylight, a small act of kindness shall make one build a bright future.

5. Sponsorship to Teach For Taiwan

Cathay has set out long-term partnership with TFT to promote education equality. By providing support to TFT for its endeavors in recruiting and training teachers for remote country, Cathay shares their vision in improving disparity in education and resources. By doing so, Cathay hopes that children stay focused and be brave on their path of growth. Passion in learning will lead them to a brilliant future, illuminating even the darkest corners, like a single lamp that can cast away darkness of thousand years.

15 Years of Everlasting Force that Supports 2nd Generation of New Immigrants

Second generation youth engage in community service for better sense of environmentalism

Cathay Charity Group initiated its partnership with Eden Social Welfare Foundation since 2010 in conducting Leadership Development Camp for 2nd Generation Immigrants for developing these children's advantageous skills. With its focus on "environmental education," the 2024 program took the participants to learn about Taiwan's ecological environment for better social integration and care to our environment. A total of 67 courses have been held, with more than 1,741 participants.



As a part of the 2nd generation program, a Vietnamese cultural event was held at New Taipei City Main Library. All participants took a group photo.

1. Cathay's Financial Program

Leveraging its core competency, Cathay invited 5 employees to give financial education to the 2nd generation school children. The children competed in groups to learn how to use their pocket money (income & expense) and to find out consumer risks (anti-fraud & scam) so that they could form right concept about money.

2. Southeast Asian Multicultural Promotion Campaign:

Lecturers were hired to provide guidance for 2nd generation of new immigrants planning Thai and Vietnamese cultural activities. They held two events in the communities for promoting diverse values and community inclusion. On June 16, the participants held a Vietnamese cultural event at New Taipei City Main Library. The 2nd generation of new immigrants introduced Vietnamese history and culture, including Hung Kings' Commemoration Day, traditional clothing Ao Dai, and Vietnamese food. One participant's mother made Tamarind juice to share with everyone.







Cathay volunteers introduced various banking services, such as saving, loan and personal finance.

3. Learning on Ecology

Integrating with the Jane Goodall Institute Taiwan's programs of "Roots & Shoots," "Green Thumb," and "Animal Carnival," environmental and animal protection courses were designed for 2nd generation of new immigrants. On September 29, a presentation was held at the Pinglin Shuiliujiao Public Senior Care Center in New Taipei City, where native guanyin trees were planted, followed by a street parade to the Pinglin Old Street Market to advocate for animal protection.

No One to Be Left Behind- Reverse the Disadvantageous Starting Line

Providing long-term company to catch children before they fall

Organized by: Cathay Charity Foundation, Cathay United Bank Foundation, and Cathay Real Estate Foundation

In a society where rural and urban development is unbalanced, children who come from marginalized and poor families couldn't have the luxury to go to talent course or tutoring school. Schools are aware of this situation, but they have little to solve such structural issues. In order to build a safety net to prevent these children from falling, Cathay conducts diverse program to guide these children and youth onto the right path to the society and develop their potential.

Cathay has started supporting the After-school Care Program since 2011. The 2024 Program was implemented at four places: Chongwen Women's Association (Oyster Shack Village in Yulin), Let Love Fly (Shiulin County in Hualien) Playful Education Association's Twilight Box (Wenshan District in Taipei), and Foundation of Pescadores Citizens's Children's Book Club (Hsiyu Township in Penghu).

Cathay's long-term support offered a safe environment for those children who fall behind in their studies and do not get care from adults after school. They could stay here to make up the gap in learning and they get to find self-recognition through diverse learning experiences.

The expenditure in this regard for 2024 is NT\$ 1,800,000 (US\$ 54,895), benefiting around 150 children and adolescents.

"I'm not going to give up halfway. I'll keep going no matter what," shared by a student from Padan Primary and Middle School in Kaohsiung. Another student from Shuiwei Elementary School said this, "I need to hang on so that I will improve." The experiences of completing challenges help children foster courage in their heart and increase their self-affirmation and recognition.

Since its launch in 2013, Cathay's Dream Come True Program that intends to support the children living in remote country or non-urban area has paid out prizes of nearly NT\$ 32 million (US\$ 975,907), supporting 187 schools and nearly 4,000 school children as of 2024. For the

11th Dream Come True Program, there were 24 schools and 480 children selected to conduct their challenges. The themes of their challenges included the following: cultural cultivation, community exploration, music creation, music inheritance, competitive sports, etc. Children show their limitless potential and get to develop the ability of resilience through the course of the challenges. During the implementation of their projects, their teachers are just like the searchlights for these children exploring their path. All worked together, achieved together and grew together. Each participating child played out their potential and shall march on a future of their own!

Selection process:

The Dream Come True Documentary Award is meant to encourage the teachers to inspire children and demonstrate their passion in education through documenting the challenge process. The 17 teams filmed their challenge process and edited into short videos for the award. In the end, the external judges selected 8 videos that touched their heart. An additional prize money of NT\$ 210,000 (US\$ 6,404) to the winners at the Award Ceremony on Aug. 21.

Dream Come True Documentary Award and Award Ceremony on Aug. 21:

The award ceremony was kicked off by a heartwarming performance by the violin band from Mudan Primary School. The Chairman of Cathay Charity Foundation Tiao-Kuei Huang, Chairman of Cathay United Bank Foundation Roger M.H. Lee, and Chairman of Cathay Real Estate Foundation Ching-Kuei Chang attended the ceremony in person, encouraging the children to pursue their dreams and challenge themselves.

Among the eight winning videos of this year's Documentary Award, three were awarded as Outstanding Films. The judges unanimously agreed that they had a delicate description about the difficulties encountered by teachers and students in the pursuit of their dreams. These videos also told

Cathay Youth Excellence Scholarship Strongly Supports Young People

Supporting the young generation in pursuit of their dreams with scholarship totaling NT\$ 8.5 million

Young people are the hope of the future, and their dreams are the starting point for changing the world! Cathay Charity Group established a Scholarship for financially challenged students as early as in 1980. Later in 2016, Cathay adapted to the society's developing trend and changed it to Cathay Youth Excellence Scholarship. This is a real action for Cathay to carry out its responsibility and mission in empowering the youth so that they are encouraged to make changes and solve the social and environmental issues.

In 2024, the number of applicants and the amount of scholarships granted both reached new highs. A total of more than NT\$ 8,500,000 (US\$ 259,225) was granted. The category of Specific Accomplishment Group aims at encouraging students to propose ESG related projects and to take action. For 2024, there were 26 groups of winners awarded with NT\$ 30,000(US\$ 915) to NT\$ 200,000(US\$

6,099). The category of Academic Merit Group presented a grant of NT\$ 50,000(US\$ 1,525) to 100 senior high students from financially challenged families. In addition, the newly added Excellence Documentary Award meant to encourage the 2023 winners to document their actions was presented to 4 teams each with a grant from NT\$ 30,000(US\$ 915) to NT\$ 50,000(US\$ 1,525).

The past 45 years has been a nonstop journey. Cathay Charity Group has spared no efforts in pouring resources for youth empowerment. As of today, the Scholarship has paid out NT\$ 220 million (US\$ 6,709,363) to over 18,860 groups of students (individuals and groups). We hope these young people would play out their strengths and take over the endeavor to create a virtuous cycle for social change.

The Presentation Ceremony took place at the conference hall of Cathay Financial Center on Dec. 10. In its long-term efforts of responding to the issues of education inequality and urban-rural gap, Cathay has come to realize that "people talent" is the crucial element that lies in these social and education issues. People talents are also the most real and urgent needs for the remote countryside. Investing in the education of remote country through bringing in young people talents would lead to the opportunity of children's positive growth.

Cathay has commenced its partnership with Teach For Taiwan since 2016 with annual sponsorship of NT\$ 4 million (US\$ 121,988). This partnership has supported 373 young teachers going to remote country through TFT project and benefited more than 7,000 school children. The Education and Empowerment initiative aims to create a force of change and make an impact on remote country education.

The TFT partnership has entered its 11th year in 2024, and a music festival for children was held for its anniversary celebration. The children from Chutian Elementary School, one of Dream Come True participating school, created their graduation song Stars in Hakka language with their teacher and a local Hakka singer's guidance, and they also performed alongside the award-winning singer 9m88. By connecting culture, music, creativity, and teamwork through creation, children learn, build self-identity and confidence, ignite endless possibilities for the future, and quietly pass down their hometown's culture.





Cathay Recognized as Anti-drug Meritorious Group for its Anti-drug Campaign

Anti-drugs & Anti-fraud Dual Program was held in schools to keep children away from drugs

To align with the regulatory policy on sustainable finance and respond to the supervisory trend of fair treatment principles, Cathay Life Insurance and Cathay Charity Foundation conducted Antidrug Anti-fraud Dual Program in schools. Through the anti-drug esport PaGamO, anti-drug board game, and anti-fraud board game, knowledge about anti-drug and anti-fraud was conveyed to schoolchildren in an educational and entertaining way.

1. Award and recognition- the title of Antidrug Meritorious Group for 2024 was awarded by the Executive Yuan

Cathay Life Insurance and the Foundation have launched anti-drug campaign for a long time. This year, Cathay was awarded with the title of Anti-Drug Meritorious Group for the second time. On the award ceremony held on Jun. 26, 2024, the Chairman of the Foundation Tiao-Kuei Huang received the award from President Lai Ching-te on behalf. Cathay was

the only financial institution that received this recognition. The Executive Yuan recognized Cathay's long-term efforts in promoting anti-drug campaign in schools, praising that "Cathay has actively committed to anti-drug efforts and its priority in administrative counseling has reaped great results in anti-drug activities."

Since 2017 when Cathay began underwriting group insurance for students nationwide, Cathay started a Sustainable Campus Project at the same time. With anti-drug campaign at its core, this Project utilized the entire Cathay Group's resources to put together systemic actions for anti-drug campaign through diverse and easily-acceptable methods of e-sports, boardgames, dance music, plays, martial arts and stunt performances for students to "identify, reject and fight against" drugs. Thanks to the recommendations from K-12 Education Administration. Ministry of Education and National Police Agency, Ministry of the Interior, Cathay's 2024 campaign received the award. For the seven years since 2017, Cathay has conducted more than 1,000 tour performances, engaging more than 10,000 Cathay volunteers and benefiting over 2.5 million students. The award news and Cathay's long-term efforts in anti-drug initiatives were publicized by Cathay Financial Holding Group's PR Department through a press release and photos, resulting in 34 pieces of media exposure, further enhancing Cathay brand image.

2. Cathay's Anti-drugs & Anti-fraud Dual Program were conducted for more than 345 Events

Ever since 2017 when Cathay Life Insurance started underwriting students' group insurance (high school and below level), Cathay has

launched Sustainable Campus Project with anti-drug campaign as the main subject, and included anti-fraud in recent years. In 2024, in collaboration with Cathay's volunteer network throughout Taiwan, Cathay launched the Anti-drugs & Anti-fraud Dual Program in the hope that students would learn about the anti-drug and anti-fraud knowledge, and stay away from drugs and fraud.

Anti-drug:

- Organizing physical anti-drug e-sports events
- Taking school children to do "anti-drug" dance Anti-fraud:
- Organizing fraud prevention campaigns with the police
- Inviting the police to record a fraud awareness video and playing the fraud prevention video during the event.

Throughout the year of 2024, Cathay conducted 345 anti-drug e-sport events at more than 216 elementary schools and junior high schools with more than 22,000 students participating; 271 anti-fraud events were launched jointly with 106 police stations with more than 10,000 participants.

Notably, in July 2024, Cathay Life Insurance partnered with Cathay Century Insurance to participate in the "2024 Anti-drug Anti-fraud

Exhibition for Safe Campus" held by the Ministry of Education and Taipei City Government. In the two exhibition areas set up by Cathay, people can learn about the hazards about the drugs and increase their awareness regarding frauds through interactive games.

3. The professional stunt group Han Dong H.D.A.

At their 2024 anti-drug tour performance, Han Dong H.D.A. offered acrobatic performances, martial arts and singing with anti-drug awareness incorporated, hoping that students could exercise more and say no to drugs. A total of five sessions were held in 2024, benefiting 4,200 students.

4. Against Wind Theatre

The Foundation continued its partnership in anti-drug campaign in 2024. Unlike previous years, which mainly focused on schools, the 2024 campaign was made to conduct at youth counseling centers for "high-risk adolescents." The details of the sessions held are as below:

It is also worth mentioning that Against Wind Theatre, Pingtung Adolescents' Dream League and the Foundation went to Kueilai Community in Pintung City on Jul. 27(Sat.), providing care to 15 high-risk adolescents who dropped out from school with 20 Cathay volunteers led by the captain Yiruen Lin. With the company of Against Wind Theatre and Pingtung Adolescents' Dream League, this group of young people have also learned baking skills. They made and sold cookies and mooncakes as their social enterprise products to make profit, which helped them gain confidence, find their goals, stay away from drugs and return to schools.



The Elevated Tree Program, a cause that commenced in 2004, aims at supporting underprivileged children who have financial difficulty or encounter major issues in their families for them to go to school without worries.

In addition to providing schooling grants, the Elevated Tree Program also extends its focus to sports. In 2024, the Program donated funds to 1,122 junior high schools and elementary schools located across Keelung City, Miaoli County, Hsinchu County, Changhua County, Yunlin County, Chiayi County, Pingtung County, Yilan County, Hualien County, and Taitung

County, benefiting 5,907 people. Moreover, the Program supported 17 sports teams (including Jianshi Junior High School's judo team) to compete in games, purchase gears and conduct training sessions. Cathay also sponsored the Sunrise Village Cup National Junior Football Game through the Program. Over the past 21 years, the Elevated Tree Program has never stopped its endeavors. As of today, the Program has donated NT\$ 320 million (US\$ 9,759,073) and supported more than 300,000 underprivileged children to go to school.


Characteristic curriculum leads to a sustainable new vision

The Emerging Artist Exhibition as part of Cathay Art Festival held for the 23rd year is particularly launched for youth artists at senior high school and university levels. It is an event for young artists to announce their unique and creative oil art and watercolors works.

The Exhibition started recruiting contestants since early August in 2023 and entered deliberation for final winners in November. Cathay Pacific offers a total of NT\$320,000 in scholarships, of which the "Gold Award" winners of the college and high school groups will receive scholarships of NT\$ 60,000 (US\$ 1,830) and NT\$ 50,000 (US\$ 1,525) respectively, to encourage outstanding emerging painters to submit their works.

From the interview with winners, we learned that each winner regarded highly of the honor of being selected into the Emerging Artist Exhibition. A lot of non-art students took great

efforts to fight for an opportunity to show their works. The Chairman of the Taiyang Art Association, who served at the judge panel, said that the level of entries in the "New Century Potential Art Exhibition" is quite high every year, and the judging process requires extra caution in order to promote outstanding original works, and thereby encourage the nurturing of a new generation of potential painters and achieve the original intention of nurturing artistic talents.

Furthermore, the Emerging Artists Exhibition also held virtual gallery on its official website for more people to appreciate. The works winning Recommendations and above were displayed at the award presentation ceremony, and Gold, Silver, and Bronze award winners were displayed at the Head Office of Cathay Life Insurance afterwards. The works passing second review were exhibited at Cathay United Art Center in January, 2024, for people to know more about these young artists of Taiwan's next generation.


Poet Artist Emma Lien Solo Exhibition



Cathay Volunteers Help Building Social Security Net

Cathay volunteers help under-privileged families weather difficulties and march into bright future

Ever since 2009, the Foundation has assigned Cathay volunteers to provide visits to underprivileged families and individuals for immediate care. At the Foundation, we hope that the volunteers' visits would help them get through the valley of darkness as soon as possible.

On April 3, a 7.2 magnitude earthquake struck Hualien. Cathay volunteers immediately went to the disaster area to provide supplies and care.

1. Disaster relief for Apr. 3 Hualien earthquake

At 7:58 a.m. on Wednesday, April 3, 2024, a magnitude 7.2 earthquake struck Taiwan, the strongest earthquake since 921. Disaster reports were received from various parts of the country, with Hualien being the worst hit area. On the day of the disaster, the Foundation immediately contacted the Dongtai District Office, where the disaster-stricken area is located. We simultaneously released the "Guidelines for the Foundation Volunteer Groups' Disaster Relief Service" on the internal platform to launch disaster relief services right away and provide necessary and immediate support to the local area. During this period, the Foundation accepted a total of 53 applications for natural disaster emergency relief from Hualien. After the case review, 27 applications were approved and a total grant of NT\$ 332,000(US\$ 10,125) was issued to help local disaster victims overcome their difficulties. Subsequently, the Foundation also followed the "Guidelines for the Foundation Volunteer Groups' Disaster Relief Rapid Service" to provide supplies and related expenses NT\$ 42,000 (US\$ 1,281) for the local teams to implement emergency matters.

2. A timely helping hand

The case client Ms. Chen, married, with stage 4 ovarian cancer, couldn't work due to her treatment. Her husband had diabetes and worked as hourly-paid casual worker. They had three children. The client's oldest son and second daughter (both not married) lived and worked in the north. Her first daughter, divorced and unemployed, just got out of prison and was raising a daughter at elementary school age. The grand daughter was living with the client. According to the volunteer's recount, the client was very touched and grateful when she received the aid money. She lost her job because of cancer and had the difficulty of paying rent. Not knowing what to do, she received the timely help from Cathay. She couldn't help feeling the warmth from the society.

In the face of price hikes, under-privileged families are under greater hardships. Cathay Donate Ghost Festival Supplies

Benefiting under-privileged families and students; sending love through practical actions

The Ghost Festival worship was conducted at Cathay Life Insurance building on Aug. 7 2024. After the worship was done, Cathay donated the offerings including long-life milk, rice, cookies, and beverages to several social welfare organizations. These organizations included Homeless Taiwan Association in Wanhua District, Taipei City. The social worker Tsung-Lin Liao said the Association's operating cost had increased due to price hike, and these supplies from Cathay meant a lot to them.

The other recipient was Taipei Parent's Association for the Visually Impaired, which was founded by a group of parents of visually impaired people in 1996. Deeply aware of the lack of resources for the visually impaired, this Association has committed to building a comprehensive service system for visually impaired children's and students' transitioning, those who lost their sight mid-life, and adult visually impaired individuals seeking employment. Their mission is to create a friendly environment where the visually impaired can

enjoy "unhindered living, education, information, and employment." This time, the supplies were distributed to low-income households, unemployed individuals, or visually impaired adults living alone within the Association. Additionally, they also provided home cooking courses, using donated materials to teach simple cooking and food preparation techniques, enhancing the self-reliance of the visually impaired people.

The third social welfare organization is Twilight Box. They operated at the Hsing Long Ankang Community. By providing various kinds of empowerment programs, they took care of those fragile adolescents from high-risk families. Currently they serve approximately 51 children and teenagers. The supplies were given to the underprivileged children and teenagers in Wenshan District. Cathay Charity Foundation hopes to support more social welfare organizations to respond to social needs and provide real materials to support the organizations' operation.

Cathay Charity Foundation Worked with World Peace League to Celebrate Mid-**Autumn Festival at Indigenous Communities**

Integrated with local produce to increase income for indigenous communities

Focusing on providing care and support to the indigenous communities, Tribal Kitchen has been based in the country to assist local industry development. This project aimed at not only providing bread for poor children, but also boosting the sales of local produce for the adults earning more income. By combining the rice grown with natural agriculture and the red quinoa noodles produced at Majia, Pingtung, the project procured these nutritious food for poor children and helped the farmers increase their income. In addition, Cathay Charity Foundation joined hands with the Tree Buy Shopping platform to connect stakeholders, help tribal elders promote agricultural products, and let the children cared by World Peace League feel the warmth and hope during Mid-Autumn Festival.

Blood Donation Campaign to Implement ESG

Recruiting more than 64,000 bags of blood for 2024

On Sep. 12, 2024, a blood donation event was co-hosted in front of Cathay Life Insurance's headquarter building with Cathay General Hospital and the Chan Peitung Team. This event received a record-breaking 192 bags of blood from medical professionals, residents in the community and Cathay staff.

Cathay Charity Foundation has started its partnership with Taiwan Blood Services Foundation to organize blood donation campaign in summer, the season when blood shortage happens, since 2000. The Foundation urged all of its sales staff and volunteers to step up when it is needed the most so that the medical supply of blood is sufficient, and more patients could restore their health.

From early May to the end of September in 2024, a total of 648 blood donation events were held across Taiwan and 64,315 bags of blood were collected. Over the past 25 years, the total accumulative blood donation has reached nearly 694,659 units, equaling 173,664,750 CC of blood. The Foundation was awarded "Excellent Blood Donation Performance in 2024" unit by the Ministry of Health and Welfare.

Notably, with the collaboration of Cathay Hospital, Cathay Life Insurance's Chanbeitung team and Taiwan Blood Services Foundation, a blood donation event was held at the Cathay Life

Insurance Head Office building on Sep. 12, 2024.

Medical personnels, people from communities and employees came to support the event and the result reached a record high of 192 bags of blood. Cathay General Hospital's Superintendent Chih-Cheng Chien and Deputy Superintendent Chao-Hsiang Lin, Chairman of Cathay Charity Foundation Tiao-Kuei Huang and Director General Li-Chiu Wang, and Captain Hsiou-Mei Lin all attended the event in person. "Donating blood to save lives is priceless. I want to take this small action to urge people to do the same. It's not a big deal but I will keep on doing it. We also need to promote that blood donation can bring positive effect so that such action would sustain," a volunteer from Chuan Yencheng team said so.

As a financial institution, Cathay offered antifraud promotion at some events. The police reminded people that they shouldn't panic if they receive any messages talking about "money." They should not deliver or transfer money to other people.

Blood donation is a simple yet meaningful act. It combines the passion of employees and people from all walks of life, which shows Cathay volunteers' commitment to promoting social inclusion and showing the warm side of society. At the same time, we will continue to move forward with the public through actions, so that this love and care can have an impact in every corner of society. Such positive and beautiful force shall be jointly delivered and extended forever. This is the practice of altruism.

Senior Friendly and Regional Revitalization Projects Help Create Happy Late Life.

Combining the USR resources to protect senior people's health and mind

Shuangyu Community organized an art-making program aiming to help the seniors achieve physical and mental well-being with the concept of "Elders Supporting Elders, Youth and Seniors Thriving Together."

Since 2022, Cathay has designated "Age-Friendly" as its key focus, with Cathay Charity Foundation and Cathay Life Insurance jointly promoting Cathay Happy Farm. Incorporating Cathay's three sustainability pillars—climate, health, and empowerment—this initiative pioneers a systematic approach to support the elderly through diverse aspects such as health and empowerment. Cathay Happy Farm combines the aspects of health, companionship, social engagement and anti-fraud to help the seniors create a happy late life. The 2024 newly established site of Cathay Happy Farm is located in the Springtime Community in Yuli Township, Hualien County, targeting around 40 local Amis, Fujian, and Hakka elders. The achievements of Cathay's five current Happy Farms in 2024 are as follows:

1. Shuangyu Community, Gongliao District, New **Taipei City**

Volunteer Projects | Cathay Happy Farm

In 2024, Cathay continued its collaboration with Professor Chung-Heng Hsieh, the leaderof Ocean University's USR program, to promote the initiative "Elders Supporting Elders, Youth and Seniors Thriving Together: Making Art for Seniors' Physical and Mental Well-Being" as the core focus. Through communitybased art activities that involved seniors, the program aimed to reshape the community and local cultural memory of Gongliao. The curriculum integrated collective creation, aesthetic courses, and art therapy activities to enhance seniors' physical and mental health, fostering their positive feelings and reducing inner loneliness. The companionship model of "elders accompanying elders" or "youth and



seniors together" strengthened community cohesion. These experiences evoked local memory. Through art creation and narrative, engaging hands, minds, voices, and even physical movements, the program stimulated senses, offering local seniors a way to embrace their later years with art, enriching their life, vitality, and sense of being.

The implementation of the program covers two aspects:

"Gardening: The Healing to Body and Soul" Making plaster flower pots and color-painting

Planting herbs and foliage plants at Happy Farms. During the attachment period of planting and maintaining the plants, the life education with positive sense and healthpromoting mindset got to be shaped in this way. The art therapy of gardening that explored the relationship between individuals and the community not only helped boosting individuals' self-identification but also strengthened their identification to the community.

• "Creative Art: Creating art to evoke feelings for the local community":

All seniors from the Shuangyu community were invited to collaborate with all elementary schools in Gongliao to create works at art courses designed around local themes, such as collective creation or handicraft workshops. These activities brought up the local seniors' aesthetic experiences and community memories. The art activities were not just art courses but served as a platform for companionship. Through the narrative of art, young and old shared and discovered local culture and emotions together.

2. Senior Day Care Center, Changbin Township, Taitung County



Partnering with University of Taipei, Cathay established a Cathay Happy Farm in Changbin, Taitung County, helping the seniors learn about healthy lifestyle and exercises.

Cathay Charity Foundation, Cathay Life Insurance and University of Taipei worked together in 2024, launching "Active Aging-Fitness and Health Promotion Program" at the Senior Day Care Center in Changbin, Taitung. Two lectures were held in Nandi Community, Changhua and Cathay Happy Farm in Changbin, Taitung on May 10 and Jun. 14 respectively. These activities were meant to increase the seniors' health awareness and provide relevant knowledge and skills.

Cathay volunteers and the teachers and students from University of Taipei provided a wealth of health information and advice to the elderly. They also helped the seniors learn how to maintain good health through regular exercise and good daily routine.

The team from University of Taipei shared the latest health science knowledge and answered the audience's questions, providing practical information and methods. Through the industry-university cooperation, we were able to provide valuable health services to community residents, and spread the health knowledge for more people.

3. Fish Pond Community, Tungshi Township, Chiayi County



On Oct. 27, 2024, Cathay volunteers from Chan Putzu attended the Black Gram Project 2.0's result presentation at Fish Pond Community in Tungshi Township, Chiayi County. They took a group photo with the community development association's members and local seniors.

Black Gram Project 2.0 was held at Fish Pond Community in 2024. The organizer Fish Pond Community Development Association invited the local residents and Cathay volunteers to join the farming of black grams. At the result presentation taking place on Oct. 27, Chanputzu team's Captain Chin-Yi Wu and 25 volunteers (including Liang-Cheng Huang) participated in the making of hand-made black tofu, in addition to their care activity to the local seniors.

Last year's black gram project was making black soy sauce, while black tofu was made for this year. These age-friendly activities were renewed every year. In addition, the USR project led by Professor Shun-Ren Tsai of Providence University and Professor Mei-Ting Chang of Chang Gung University of Science and Technology worked in collaboration with the Ministry of Agriculture to conduct the food and agricultural health promotion. The Black Gram Project 2.0 that laid emphasis on the senior's life wisdom and the local cultural traditions attracted more than 20 elderly people to step out of their homes and resume their participation to the community affairs. A total of 25 elderly people (average age of 75) participated the activity.

4. Nandi Community, Shetou Township, Changhua County

The Cathay Happy Farm in Nandi Community, Changhua County cooperated with Professor Kai-Lin Liang of National Chi Nan University. Professor Liang specializes in the field of longterm care management and is the CEO of the USR program at National Chi Nan University. He has undertaken projects from public sector such as the National Development Council, Ministry of Agriculture, and the Ministry of Health and Welfare. He is good at combining students with local organizations in new activities.

On the Sunday of Jul. 17, Professor Liang visited Nandi Community for the first time to conduct a field survey for the 2024 collaboration plan. The main focus was to conduct a functional health assessment for the seniors, evaluating their physical functions and self-cognitive abilities. Through planting in vegetable and fruit gardens, the program aimed to enhance the seniors' muscle strength and social participation. Learning new knowledge also helped improve the quality of life. Notably, the project outcomes were compiled into a comprehensive lesson plan to be shared with neighboring communities, expanding the local impact of Cathay Happiness Farm.

5. Springtime Community, Chihiluo Tribe, Yuli Township, Hualien County



Cathay volunteers from Chan Huahsien attended the result presentation at Springtime Community in Yuli, Hualien County, spending a nice Sunday afternoon with more than 30 Amis, Fujian and Hakka seniors.

For the year of 2024, the Foundation continued to deepen its collaboration with the Rural Development and Soil and Water Conservation Agency (referred to as the SWCA) under the Ministry of Agriculture. Recommended by the SWCA Hualien Branch, the Foundation partnered with the MOA Hualien Branch, Springtime Community Development Association, Chihiluo Tribe Cultural Heritage and Economic Development Association, and the USR program led by Associate Professor Nian-Tzu Geng from Tzu Chi University of Science and Technology. We built the fifth Cathay Happy Farm at Springtime Community targeting around 40 Amis, Fujian, and Hakka senior residents.

From Nov. 30 to Dec. 1, 2024, Springtime Community Development Association and Chihiluo Tribe Cultural Heritage and Economic Development Association, in collaboration with the Hualien County Government, held "FALI FALI Music Festival," a cultural experience event. The event invited people to come to the Amis cultural market and concert, while also arranging for Amis and Hakka seniors from Springtime Community to join. Cathay volunteers and Springtime Community

Development Association's social workers felt the enthusiasm and energy from the seniors because of the event. In particular, the Hakka seniors not only sang Hakka folk songs on the spot but also prepared Hakka delicacy the glutinous rice balls. Happily chitchatting with Cathay volunteers, they showed their activeness for life.

Cathay Volunteers Relay in Love

Model volunteers submitting sustainable and charity proposals for cycle of kindness

To honor the selfless dedication of our colleagues and inspire the public to join the cause and engage in social welfare, Cathay Charity Foundation annually recognizes outstanding volunteer staff and teams devoted to public service so that their model can inspire other colleagues. Each year at the recognition event, people find out "persistence" is steadfastly upheld by a group of people who seek no reward but simply wish for the well-being of others. It is this power of love that makes an impact to our society. In order to foster the positive cycle, the Foundation invites these exemplary volunteers to make proposals for public welfare initiatives. The related themes include environmental friendliness, youth empowerment and senior care. By doing so, we want to carry out corporate sustainability commitment and continue, as a good neighbor, our engagement with the locals.

In 2024, 32 teams submitted their entries, and 8 exemplary Cathay volunteer teams were selected to receive the fund for their Dream Projects, NT\$ 800,000 (US\$ 24,398) in total. The proposals contained a wide variety of subjects, including the Puli volunteer team working with local businesses and organizations to hold a charity sale to support the Chen Chou Children's Home, and volunteers from Chingshui Service Center inviting friends and family to support the Taiwan Reforestation Association in planting tree seedlings. The Center Manager Shu-Nyu Chan said, "the one who benefits the most is everyone who participates in it." We hope this platform would let more people know that kindness and love are constantly happening around us. Cathay consistently encourages our staff to





participate in volunteer services with love and passion, making our society less indifferent and more compassionate, and lightening up the happiness. The specific achievements are described as follows:

1.Chingshui Service Center - Planting seedlings and restoration of Taiwan's native trees

The Center Manager Shu-Nyu Chan, also a longterm volunteer, submitted the proposal working with Taiwan Reforestation Association to promote tree seedling cultivation activity for Taiwan's native shallow-mountain plant communities. Fifty people, including Cathay staff, their families and customers responded to the cause and joined the planting of Taiwan native seedlings of threeleaved Acanthopanax. Ms. Chan mentioned that this tree-planting activity took place at the Dadu Mountain Reforestation Center in Taichung City, starting with "seedling cultivation." The nursery aimed to produce 10,000 seedlings annually, with over 70% being native tree species from Taiwan's natural forests. The seedlings were used not only for the Association's restoration test zones but also provided for public sector's needs. This initiative promoted the sustainability of Taiwan's forests and carbon reductions so that our forests and planet could restore their health.

Ms. Zhan and the staff at the Chingshui Service Center said that protecting the Earth and sustainability is not a matter for one person, but a group of like-minded people who work together to exert their influence. By doing one's bit, volunteers continuously promote the environmental and climate action in their daily life.

2. Team Chuan Wanho Lihsin- Anti-fraud Squad

In terms of the "Anti-fraud Squad" project, sales agent Ching-Yuan Kuo from Chuan Wanho Lihsin Liaison Office proposed to conduct interschool exchanges between urban and rural elementary schools for children to mutually learn each other's strengths while promoting anti-fraud awareness. This project invited police officers, retired Cathay volunteers, and Basegarden to join the antifraud. Songshan Elementary School's teachers and students and retired Cathay volunteers were trained to be the seed instructors for the anti-fraud board game. On Nov. 13, 2024, a group of 40 people including teachers, students, parents and Cathay volunteers visited Wenshui Elementary School to conduct the event and the Cathay volunteers from Chan Miaoli also joined the event. Through the fun and educational approach of the anti-fraud board game, the project brought the anti-fraud awareness among students. The children were encouraged to share the knowledge with their parents and grandparents at home. The activity was highly praised by the students, teachers, and school principal.

3. Team Chuan Kaofeng- Dance to Celebrate at Huichuan Nursing Home

Elected as a model volunteer in 2024, team Chuan Kaofeng's sales agent Chi-Yang Ku is a person dedicated to public welfare and has accumulated volunteer hours. He proposed a care event in which the indigenous dance troupe Wenchen Dance Troupe performing at Huichuan Nursing Home and received the Foundation's sponsorship. The event combined the cheerful and highly cultural dance performance and anti-fraud promotion to celebrate Father's Day in advance for Huichuan Nursing Home's residents.

The average age of Wenchen Dance Troupe's dancers is from 55 to 70 years old. With the passion to dance, they do regular training and often perform for schools and temple fairs. This event took place also for the birthday celebration at Huichuan Nursing Home, showing Cathay volunteers' commitment to age-friendly actions. On the day of the celebration event, Cathay volunteers wheeled the nursing home residents to Agongdian Riverbank Park to watch the indigenous dance performance by the Wenchen Dance Troupe. Additionally, officers from the Shoutian Police Station conducted an anti-fraud awareness session for everyone present, deepening their understanding of common tactics used by fraud groups. The Model Volunteer Dream Project not only promoted the physical, mental, and financial well-being of the elderly but also helped the residents of Huichuan Nursing Home celebrated a memorable and heartwarming Father's Day in advance.

Notably, the 2024's Taipei event was resumed after a three-year suspension, and this time more Cathay companies joined the cause, including Cathay Financial Holding Group and Cathay Consultant both of which participated for the first time.

Cathay has always valued the issues of the senior communities, actively participating in community services and promoting related activities. We trained our Cathay volunteers to become the instructors of anti-fraud board game, collaborating with the National Police Agency and local police stations to support care services at community centers for seniors.

Leveraging Cathay's core function in financial risk control, Cathay volunteers used the board game Guards against Frauds to teach the seniors how to identify scams so as to protect their wealth. At the same time, these activities helped the police main financial order, establish safe environment and

carry out the sustainable development for corporations and society.

In addition, Cathay also supported the retired volunteers to expand their interpersonal relationships by providing anti-fraud training.

The sales agent Ching-Yuan Kuo from Chuan Wanho Liaison Office provided training to retired volunteers, encouraging them to step out of their homes and into the community, demonstrating care and support for seniors. Participating in anti-fraud activities helped the seniors learn how to avoid scams and protect their assets, with a total of over 115 seniors participating and benefiting in 2024.

Summer medical camp for elementary school students

Cathay General Hospital has held a medical summer camp for primary school students every year since 2007, except during the Covid period. The summer camp has been held for more than ten years and has been well received by parents. The 2024 summer camp was held on July 10 and 11, with a total of nearly 100 primary school students participating. The course content is designed to focus on the physical and mental health of

students, including arranging infectious disease specialists to teach about common infectious diseases, pediatricians and nutritionists to talk about balanced nutrition and healthy growth, and psychiatrists and psychologists to teach the children how to detect addiction to electronic devices and methods to relieve stress. In addition, the organizers designed life education courses incorporated with the scenarios of the inconveniences experienced by seniors. This was meant to cultivate children's empathy and tolerance. at different medical units so that they could understand the job nature of different medical professionals. We hope to cultivate their interest in medicine through a rich curriculum and increase the students' ability to use the medical knowledge they learned to help others and themselves.

Calling on employees to donate blood to benefit patients who need blood transfusion

In recent years, the number of blood donors has been decreasing, but the demands of blood for seniors are increasing in our aging society. It was often reported that blood bank was in short supply. As a result, Cathay General Hospital worked with Cathay Charity Foundation, Cathay Life Insurance's Chan Peitung Team and Taiwan Blood Services Foundation in conducting blood donation event on Sep. 12, 2024. The event received great response from medical workers, communities, and Cathay staff with collection of 192 bags of blood within one day. Cathay General Hospital's Superintendent Chih-Cheng Chien and Deputy, Superintendent Chao-Hsiang Lin,

Cathay Charity Foundation's Chairman Tiao-Kuei Huang and Director General Li-Chiu Wang, and Cathay Life Insurance's Captain Hsiu-Mei Lin all attended the event in person. A bag of blood may save one person's life. It was hoped that this activity would replenish the blood bank in a timely manner and benefit patients in urgent need of blood.

So, starting from 2024, some of these volunteers picked up scissors and learned to do it, and the others climbed up to 5th floor with Father's Day card. They may have been normal people quietly doing these things, but they helped the patients spend their last moments with more dignity and warmth.

From hospital wards to alleyways, this group of selfless volunteers, alongside the palliative care team, reached out to accompany countless families through dark times of their life. Through these acts, medical services could achieve more and reach further, enabling holistic care with greater flexibility and possibilities.

Supporting the treatment and prevention of metabolic chronic diseases in Saint Lucia

Cathay General Hospital and the International Cooperation and Development Foundation have launched the St. Lucia Metabolic Chronic Disease Prevention System Strengthening Project since 2023. Currently, this project has produced 12 St. Lucia seed teachers and has keep sending delegations to St. Lucia for field visits and guidance. The seed teachers returned to their country to open care program and exercise program for

metabolic chronic disease patients. They also used social media to promote health education, demonstrate nutritional cooking and other activities, which have received great feedback from locals. In addition, Cathay General Hospital, leveraging its expertise in medical informatics, assisted St. Lucia in improving screening efficiency by developing the "i-Screen" system. This digital platform collects community and household screening data, streamlining the screening process and enhancing data entry efficiency. The system was officially launched in 2024, with Foreign Minister and ICDF Chairman Chia-Lung Lin among the attendees. St. Lucia's senior government, including Prime Minister Philip j. Pierre and Health and Senior Affairs Minister Moses Jn. Baptiste, highly praised the i-Screen system. They said that this system could effectively improve chronic disease prevention and treatment, greatly reduced the paper workload of medical staff, and the digital screening data could be used as reference for decision-making in chronic disease prevention and treatment. That has become one of the country's achievements in information technology.

Actively participating in international medical aid mission

Guided by the humanitarian principle of "Medicine Without Borders, Service Without Boundaries," Cathay General Hospital has sent out medical missions for numerous times to provide free medical services in Fiji, Nepal, India, and Mongolia since 2007. In 2024, we continued the organization of overseas medical aid missions: joining non-profit organizations to go to Nigeria for consultations and screenings; going to Nepal's MMTH Hospital for consultations, case discussions, lectures, teaching about laparoscopic surgery, sharing expertise in preoperative anesthesia

assessment, intraoperative anesthesia management, postoperative pain relief, and recovery. Through our active participation in international medical aid actions, we promote international medical exchanges and advance the UN Sustainable Development Goals.

Signing letters of intent with overseas hospitals and promoting medical exchanges and training for foreign medical personnels

In order to implement the UN Sustainable Development Goals - establishing diverse partnerships and providing good health and well-being, Cathay General Hospital actively facilitates training for foreign medical personnel in Taiwan, aiming to enhance local clinical medical technology and services. Cathay General Hospital has collaborated with 19 hospitals across countries including Pakistan, Mongolia, St. Lucia, Vietnam, and Nepal. Through signing letters of intent for medical cooperation, both parties engage in international medical exchange conferences, clinical technique guidance, demonstration teaching, case discussions, and training for foreign medical personnel. In 2024, many trainees have completed their training and returned to their own countries to benefit more local patients.

Cathay General Hospital has adhered to its purpose of "paying back to the society with medical services." In addition to pursuing the improvement of medical service quality, we will continue our endeavors in public welfare and keep using our expertise in medicine and information to assist our foreign friend nations to enhance their medical quality, implementing the UN SDGs.
